Collins Aerospace Tests Next-Gen Spacesuit

Spaceflight Now (2/1) reports that on Tuesday, teams with Collins Aerospace "completed a testing series called the Crew Capability Assessment." This is one "of several milestones laid in NASA's Exploration Extravehicular Activity Services (xEVAS) contract valued at \$97.2 million and awarded to Collins in December 2022." Collins is "designing its suit in collaboration with ILC Dover and Oceaneering." Former NASA astronauts, John "Danny" Olivas and Dan Burbank, "each donned the suit and performed a series of test objectives while onboard a Zero Gravity plane that's able to perform parabolic maneuvers to simulate microgravity for short bursts."

NASA, SpaceX Target Late February Launch Date For Crew-8 Astronaut Mission

SPACE (2/1) reports that SpaceX's next astronaut launch "for NASA will take place in just three weeks, if all goes according to plan." February 22 "is the target launch date for Crew-8, which will send four people to the International Space Station (ISS) for a six-month stay." Crew-8's Crew Dragon capsule "will launch atop a SpaceX Falcon 9 rocket from Pad 39A at NASA's Kennedy Space Center in Florida." Aboard the Dragon "will be Matthew Dominick, Michael Barratt and Jeanette Epps of NASA and Alexander Grebenkin of the Russian space agency Roscosmos."














AIAA Houston Section: Mexico and the Section's territory in Texas AIAA Region VII (International) and Region IV (Mexico and four states of the USA)



Ken Salazar was sworn in as United States Ambassador to Mexico on September 2, 2021.

In 2009, President Obama nominated Mr. Salazar to serve as Secretary of Interior where he had a lead role on the Obama-Biden agenda on energy and climate, the nation's conservation agenda including America's Great Outdoors, and Indian Country. Ambassador Salazar has been a lifelong fighter for civil rights and the inclusion of Latinos in the American dream.

In 1998, Mr. Salazar was elected as Colorado Attorney General and became the first Latino ever elected to statewide office in Colorado. He was reelected as Attorney General in 2002. In 2004, Attorney General Salazar was elected to the United States Senate for Colorado becoming the first Latino democrat to be elected to the United States Senate since 1972.

Ambassador Salazar has been admitted to practice law in state and federal courts, including the United States Supreme Court.

Ambassador Salazar and his family have farmed along the banks of the Rio Grande River in New Mexico and Colorado for more than four centuries.
